

Report to Membership on Not for Profit Incorporation

Current Status

- Not incorporated, operating as an informal network
- Established membership last year, a Steering Committee elected at first Annual Membership Meeting
- Members sign up online, no fees charged
- Obtained funding through partnerships with registered charities

Going Forward

Coordinators, in conjunction with partner agencies and Steering Committee, determined that it is desirable to incorporate as a not for profit organization, but not to apply for charitable status.

Changes to TUG membership

What stays the same

- Both individuals and organizations/businesses can be members
- Members do not need to be residents of Toronto or employed here
- We don't want to exclude people from membership or TUG activities on the basis of cost
- You don't have to be a member of TUG to sign up to the Google group, attend networking meetings, access web resources or participate in a working group

What changes

- Members gain a more formal, legal role in decision-making for the organization once TUG attains NFP status
- Clearer guidelines for member rights and responsibilities
- We will be asking members for contributions

By asking for contributions we accomplish two things:

- 1. Build member commitment
- 2. Generate revenue/resources for the organization independent of grants

Individuals

\$25 with a Pay What You Can option.

Fees can be waived for students/volunteers but this will not be promoted widely.

Organizations or businesses Small \$50

Large \$100

Size of the organization/business is self-defined at this point Contributions of resources (such as meeting space, staff time) can be accepted in lieu of membership fee

Next Steps in the Not for Profit Process

- 1. Draft bylaws
- 2. Set up administrative functions
- 3. Establish a Board of Directors with assistance from members of current Steering Committee
 - a. Small Board of approximately 5-6 members
- 4. Establish an Advisory Group
 - a. Not a legal entity but a practical one: people we can call upon for specific advice or expertise on an as-needed basis. Advisors can contribute to the organization, gain recognition for it with less formal commitment
 - b. Will help us to increase representativeness of TUG leadership

We anticipate completing this process by the end of 2016.
